Academics

Lyndon Academy's high school helps prepare students for tomorrow's economy. Students strive for academic excellence in languages, STEM and more, and they have a solid and distinguished academic foundation that sets them apart from other college applicants. Well-rounded, multilingual high school students with high college placement scores do not get passed over by admissions personnel. That is by design at Lyndon Academy. In the final years of a student's secondary education, we continue to provide that individual attention in the classrooms and in college guidance, while continuing to allow our students to explore and build fantastic resumes.

College Credits

The rigor and the design of the language arts programs allows students to walk into ninth grade with up to nine high school credits. They have the opportunity to fast-track through our upper school, and they may take advantage of dual enrollment and AP course opportunities. If they are mature enough and feel compelled to go on to college after three years of high school, they can do it. Because of these options, we have alumni that have transitioned into college and been classified as sophomores and juniors and earning bachelor's degrees within two or three years on campus.

Both opportunities allow parents the opportunity to save money at the secondary or post-secondary level.

Electives

We offer a wide variety of electives courses with over forty different opportunities. We provide courses on the ground and online here at Lyndon. The depth and variety of courses allow students to explore career paths and expand their minds beyond the core requirements for graduation.
